James: A Manual for Maturity

Have you set any goals for the New Year? I have two goals for 2025: 1) Head back to the gym and strive to be healthier (especially as I turn 50 years old in February!); and 2) learn how to whittle (and use the whittling kit I received for my birthday this last year) so that I can carve out the pieces for a nativity set. There are certainly more things I hope to accomplish, but those are the two at the top of the list.

One of the goals that I seem to have every year is to continue to mature in my faith—to grow closer in my walk with Jesus and to love the people the Lord has placed around me more fully.

As we gather for worship in the New Year, I will be preaching new sermon series called – James: A Manual for Maturity. The letter of James, often referred to as the "Proverbs of the New Testament," offers profound insights into Christian living, focusing on the theme of maturity in faith.

Some of you traditional Lutherans may lament, "Not James!" Didn't Martin Luther famously call James an epistle of straw?" You continue your protest. "Why, James only mentions Jesus two times—just two times! I'm with Luther," you say, "Compared to the likes of Paul and John, James is a theological lightweight!"

Not so fast. James has much to teach us about God's grace and our Spirit-empowered response. From the first to the last verse of his book, this half-brother of Jesus gives us one of the most practical pictures of the Christian faith in all the Bible.

James begins with a startling assertion: "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds" (James 1:2). Maturity in our faith is not just about the quiet times of peace but is profoundly cultivated through trials. James teaches us that perseverance through these challenges makes us mature and complete, not lacking anything (James 1:4). How do we respond to adversity? Do we see it as an opportunity to grow or as an obstacle? Reflecting on our personal trials, let's seek the maturity that comes from trusting in God's purpose.

At the heart of his letter, James insists that we are saved by faith alone; but saving faith is never alone. Faithfulness does not stop with a profession of faith but is a ticket to a life of continued transformation and service. To underscore this theme, James employs the word "mature" seven times in his five-chapter letter.

This New Year, I hope you accept the challenge to grow in maturity. Let's embrace trials as opportunities for growth, seek wisdom from above, control our tongues, and let our faith be active in love. May our journey through the Book of James this month enrich our spiritual lives, making us more like Christ in every aspect.

In this sermon series, **James: A Manual for Maturity**, the lineup of sermons is as follows:






Youth had fun at our Christmas party where we did a Nativity escape room and built gingerbread houses.
